We will ask for volunteers to begin to supply a meal each month beginning in July.

We are happy to report that our **Ukraine family** seems to be thriving, as they are now financially independent, with Ilya having a full-time job in the trucking industry.

In the wider world, we support the upcoming trip to **Guatemala** to install a water system in a village populated with indigenous people and to build stoves in homes for families who now live with open firepits for cooking.

In response to Jesus' blessing to those who "visited me when I was in prison," the Witness and Outreach Committee feels led to pursue a ministry to inmates in the **Baldwin County Jail in Bay Minette**. We are working with the chaplain there who assures us of the safety of volunteers.
