Service of Darkness (Tenebrae)

Since the eighth century Christians have observed the Office of Tenebrae, or, The Service of Darkness, recalling the darkness which fell on the earth at the time of Jesus' crucifixion. The holy table is bare except for seven lighted candles. After each reading, one of the candles is extinguished, and the lights of the church progressively grow dimmer.

At the end of the worship, with the church in complete darkness, the loud closing of the lectern Bible represents the sealing of Jesus' tomb with the stone. Then a bell will solemnly toll—once for each year of his earthly life. Please honor the total silence as we rise and depart the church.
