## Congregational Meditation

There is no Benediction this evening, as the service will continue tomorrow evening, Good Friday, at 7 o'clock. Please use this time for quiet meditation and depart in silence.

Service Notes

*Maundy Thursday recalls the Last Supper between Jesus and his disciples as they were gathered in the upper room. The word Maundy comes from the Latin word mandatum, meaning "mandate." It refers to the words of Christ, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another."*

*Tonight's prelude is based on the Gregorian chant "Ubi caritas et amor, Deus ibi est" (Where charity and love are, God is there). Composed during the late 8<sup>th</sup> century, this melody is traditionally used on Maundy Thursday. The arrangement this evening is by the contemporary American composer Charles Callahan.*
